PERFORMANCE NOTES

Performers should understand the piece expects a certain level of theatrics. The two pianists performing the piece should be comfortable and confident with speaking in performance, and the performers in question should be able to project. If necessary and applicable, rudimentary electronic amplification of both voices is acceptable.

PROGRAMME NOTES

Have You Heard the News? is a piano duo written for the PLUG Festival 2025. The piece is conceptualised around two characters conversing about various news headlines with each other, with each headline being more ridiculous than the last. Inspired by children's prose like Dr Seuss, the text, written by the composer, rhymes and alliterates with an irregular rhythm, and lays the foundation for the rhythmic and metrical language of the piece. The titular phrase "have you heard the news?" was the both the starting point for the project and the foundation of the structure for the text. It begins most sections and serves as the instigator of the discourse between the two characters. This design was where the project was conceived, trying to find different ways for the two characters to pose that question to the other. From there, the text was developed and completed by creating all the wacky and ludicrous headlines found within the piece.
